The Clark Art Institute Williamstown, MA August 21 & 22, 2020

AMOC's first, sold-out live performances since
March 2020 took place on The Clark's stunning
Ando Terrace. The program featured Miranda
Cuckson and Christopher Burns's award-winning
rendition of Luigi Nono's *La lontananza nostalgica*utopica futura, a richly theatrical, spatialized composition for violin and electronics. Staged especially for the breathtaking encounter of landscape and architecture at The Clark, this thought-provoking
work explores the question: "how do we move forward when no path seems to exist?"

## Broken Theater

October 19 - November 1, 2020 Mass MoCA, North Adams, MA

November 16 - December 6, 2020 La MaMa, New York, NY

Created in a period of isolation and fear, *Broken Theater* is a letter to our time, born of a deep desire to connect. Bobbi Jene Smith and her collaborators excavate the connections between effort and humiliation, abuse of power and love, and chaos and structure. Scenes in the piece stage the farcical theatrics of authoritarian world leaders, whose denials of the pandemic, and of their own brokenness and vulnerability, had catastrophic consequences for their citizens (and in many cases their own health). *Broken Theater* is a microcosm reflecting what we see as a collective politics of death: the valuing of short-term power and profit over human life; the dehumanizing categorization of those who functioned within their vision of society, and those rejected as broken.

Broken Theater was captured as a feature film in Fall 2020 (release date to be announced).

A live version will premiere and tour in Fall 2022.

AMOC's largest project yet was workshopped almost exactly one year after originally scheduled. A brand new devised work with original music by Matthew Aucoin, directed by Zack Winokur, and choreographed by Bobbi Jene Smith, *The No One's Rose* is a music, dance, and theater piece that reflects on the deeply personal experience of grief and the collective process of rebuilding after immense loss.


# Comet Poppea

# Gallup (Na'nízhoozhí)

A new short film released May 28, 2021 in collaboration with LA Opera

As part of LA Opera's Digital Short series, AMOC artists recorded a new work, composed by Matthew Aucoin with poetry by Jake Skeets, which serves as the backdrop for an unflinching yet tender portait of one of the hardest-hit areas affected by the pandemic: Gallup, New Mexico (called Na'nízhoozhí in Skeets's and Lowe's native Navajo language).

The audio recording of this piece is featured on AMOC's first commercial album, *Orphic Moments*, released in partnership with the Boston Modern Orchestra Project.




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
